4.1 Bridging Language for NIC and external organization learning outcomes

Background:

Since the implementation of a requirement for course learning outcomes to be reviewed by the Centre for Teaching & Learning Innovation (CTLI), a discussion has been raised about how to deal with externally mandated learning outcomes or competencies which must be included in the Authorized Course Description (ACD) per the rules of these external bodies, as well as to facilitate accreditation and transfer.

One solution proposed by the Curriculum Committee (CC), is to list both the external learning outcomes as well as the NIC learning outcomes. It was suggested that the NIC learning outcomes be listed first, then along with some bridging language, the external learning outcomes would follow such as:

Upon successful completion of this course students will/should (?) be able to:

• List of NIC outcomes

The NIC learning outcomes above have been derived from, and are implementations of, externally referenced learning outcomes, characterized with NIC values and local/Indigenous culture. In fulfilling the above, students will also have met the requirements set by the external organization:

Upon successful completion of this course students will/should be able to:

• List of external learning outcomes

Discussion Points:

- At many other institutions they have only a course outline, not both an ACD and course outlines.
- Solutions to this issue are currently in progress including addressing technical and procedural issues.
- CTLI consultation will include mapping the alignment between NIC and externally mandated learning outcomes.

It was recommended that EdCo form a subcommittee to research how other institutions are dealing with this issue and confirm the expectations of these external organizations.

6. New Business

6.1 HyFlex at North Island College – Frequently Asked Questions *Discussion*:

- Faculty expressed several concerns about the consultation, communication and implementation processes for this new pedagogical delivery model and any related future policy developments.
- Administration clarified that this new method would be tested only with specific courses and
 instructors who would benefit from its flexibility, and that students and faculty will supported in the
 transition.
- Faculty were encouraged to bring their concerns to the VP Academic and/or their Department Chairs and Deans to help to ensure the most successful rollout of this new delivery method.

7. Information / Correspondence

- 7.1 (Verbal) Report from VP Academic (T. Bellavia)
 - The QAPA external reviewers' report has been circulated and now NIC must respond by March 15th. L. Knaack has been conducting sessions to get feedback. The response will be sent to EdCo for information before it goes to the ministry.
 - The president's office has instructed the VP Academic and the VP Student & College Experience to develop NIC's first Strategic Enrollment Plan (SEM). This includes hiring an Associate VP College Experience who will be responsible to lead this process. It will be an inclusive process including staff and faculty. The plan will need to review the overall program compliment to ensure it meets the mandate of the ministry and includes the requirements of both international and domestic students. Metrics will be developed in-house after consultation and feedback.
 - Recent Canada Immigration changes include a cap on International students with a 35% reduction. NIC's enrollment is about 14% International students so it is well situated to adapt to these changes. BC will be allocated 50K study permits. Study permits will have to show evidence that students are studying in programs linked to labour market outcomes.

- 7.2 (Verbal) Report from Indigenous Education (K. Shopland)
 - Staffing update: Indigenous counsellor, Kathryn Priest Perry, will replace Sara Lawrence in CR & CV while Sara is on leave.
 - Indigenous Education Council will be gathering at the end of February to review the *Working Together* strategic plan at its 2.5 year mark to review its progress from a college-wide perspective, and then prioritizing its goals and next steps.
 - Indigenous Education has been working with the Komox Cultural Connections Committee who have been working on the art components for the student housing project. Pamela Mitchell, a Komox First Nations artist, was chosen by committee members to create artwork for the front of the building. K. Shopland shared the image of an etching of a frog design called the Knowledge Keeper. The frog is known for its adaptability and knowledge, and for bringing great wealth and power as he travels and lives in the two worlds of water and land.
